1. IDENTIFICATION:

Course: Advanced Research Methods in Pedagogical Theory and Practices in Physical Education (Métodos Avançados de Pesquisa em Teoria e Prática Pedagógica em Educação Física)

2. SYLLABUS:

Methodological approach to emerging topics presented by international researchers invited by the Program in the field of Pedagogical Theory and Practices in Physical Education.

3. OBJECTIVES:

The objective of the course is to conduct a critical analysis of the reproduction of different types of identities, such as national minorities, cultural/ethnic groups, gender, and sexual identities, in the sports context of Canada, Brazil, and other countries. The course will explore various sites of identity construction, including recreational, competitive, and professional sports.

4. CONTENT:

- Sport, Nationalism and Multiculturalism; Monday Morning and Afternoon
- Sport, Masculinity and Heteronormativity;
- Sport, Femininity and legitimacy in Sport;
- Sport, Femininity and Heteronormativity.

5. TEACHING STRATEGIES



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This course consists of a seminar to discuss the issues emerging in the required readings and class presentations regarding the reproduction of identities in and through sport.

Specifically, students are expected to:

- 1. Attend seminars.
- 2. Read the required texts before each class, to prepare comments/questions related to these readings and bring a copy of the readings to class to actively participate in class discussion;
- 3. Present the ongoing research or a research project for publication in article format.

6. ASSESSMENT

- 1) Progressive and daily, based on student involvement in classroom discussions (Grade: 4.0);
- 2) Reflections on Required Readings (Grade: 4.0): Write reviews on the texts that will be used in the course.
- 3) Presentation of ongoing research or a research project to be published in article format (Grade: 2.0).
- The course will be conducted in English.
